DEEPER IN DEBT

The Student Loan Crisis

Can students fund their higher education and still stay solvent?

Becky Mock guided us through AAUW's "Deeper In Debt" Power Point presentation that gave us such graphic evidence of the debt inequities. ([click here](#) for full presentation). AAUW's research reveals important data regarding the effects of securing college loans on women vs men, white vs color and the respective job prospects, earning power and ability to pay back loans. Many who are saddled with this debt are looking at a lifetime of indebtedness.

Becky also arranged to have a speaker to address the issue of student loan-debt and relate her experiences with the students. Traci Veyl, Financial Aid Director at Merced

College, introduced several ideas to avoid lifelong indebtedness:

- Consolidate all existing college loans that one may have.
- Consider attending a 2-year "junior" college which can often be free of any tuition charges.
- Speak with financial aid directors who can offer alternative means of financing.
- Financial Aid directors are aware of other grants, endowments, scholarships- many of which remain untapped (There is one endowment from the estate of Tillie Stroming for Mariposa students that is often overlooked).

Attendees were given postcards, pens, addresses and time to write to our three representatives in Washington to express our concerns and suggestions for legislation.

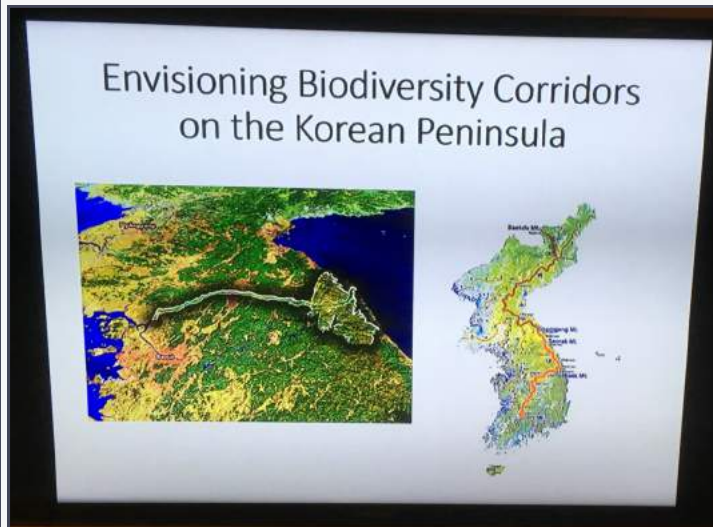

PROJECT UPDATES:

Yard Sale: *Reported on by Maddie for Sharon*

Yard Sale was on October 13th and 14th. It went really well! Made \$3609.00 there were several large nonmember items that helped with sales. Maddie met with Sara Cox, after-school coordinator, working on a packet. 2nd day of tutors is not needed. 1 day per week is what the school would like. Look at sending a card/form in the classroom folder in order to share info about the student and any concerns. Maddie suggested a sign in sheet, with time in & time out. Sandi suggested that we haven't defined the program, so we can have measurable goals. Let's work on putting something together about success criteria for program once the details of the program are finalized.
