Coffee and Convos: Rock Down to Electric Avenue (aka John C. Fremont's new state of the art Equipment Suite) --Maddie Brown



On Saturday, Feb 3rd, our regularly occurring Coffee and

Convos gathering had the pleasure of hosting two John C. Fremont employees (3 if you count Rebecca!). Matt Matthesen, CEO and Interim CFO, and David Williams, Imaging Department Manager. The gentlemen started the morning by discussing Elizabeth Blackwell- the first woman to receive a medical degree in the United States. It was an interesting coincidence that this Coffee and Convos occurred on her birthday! Throughout the morning Matt and David shared developments in John C. Fremont's imagery and scanning department, including the new state of the art mammography suite and the new MRI, CT, and bone density scanning services. One of our main topics to discuss, mammograms, came with some very interesting facts. Hospitals must perform 600-700 per year to maintain federal certification. Each individual technologist must perform 200 per year to maintain his/her own

qualification. Additional interesting facts throughout the morning included the count of 5 out of 8 primary care providers in our community are women!

In addition to learning about the neat technologies available in our own community, Matt and David discussed the challenges, benefits, and even a few detriments (true realists!). John C. Fremont Hospital is self-funded. Over the last two to three years, the hospital has been working on a public paradigm shift, and through its success, our community has benefited! There has been an increase of local residents choosing our home town hospital, and through this the hospital is able to provide higher quality goods and services- a true win-win scenario. With the government mandate in 2030 for a new hospital, scheduling lab work, MRIs, and other types of appointments increases hospital revenue help provide funds to pay for the new hospital. If you have a primary care provider out of the area, you can request to have your prescriptions, lab work, and

different scans transferred to John C. Fremont as long as your insurance is okay with it!

While the morning was full of facts, figures, a bit of catharsis, and warm gooey freshly made cinnamon twists- there was one major take away, per Matt's catchy phrase. These new machines are *our* machines, and this hospital is *our* hospital. With a final shout out to AAUWers Rebecca and Bernadette, who work hard to ensure positive experiences across a variety of departments, Matt stated that our little hospital has seen a 100% increase in intakes over the last 4 years!

John C. Fremont is a critical component for our immediate community and satellite communities throughout the county, as well as northern Madera County. As one of the traveling nurses observed, "It is a little hospital with a big heart." We hope to have Matt and David back to speak at a public program, so if you missed out this round, you're in luck! Unfortunately, we can't guarantee warm cinnamon twists.

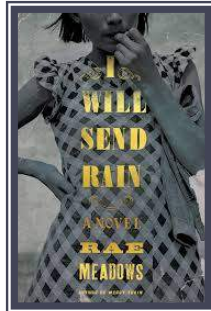

They are faced with many challenges which they have to solve creatively. Each family member approaches the stresses in a different way. The marriage is in danger as the husband and wife struggle with their own demons. The teenage daughter is in need of a mother who does not know how to help her daughter. The younger son is mute and suffers from dust pneumonia, which was common during the Dust Bowl. The group was in consensus about enjoying the book. The author did an excellent job

with characterization, giving us just what we needed to get to know each one. She was able to paint a picture of what life was like without going into long drawn out descriptions. The story draws you in to see how this family handles the stress of the Dust Bowl while staying strong.
