



Lucky Boy by Shanthi Sekaram

Discussion Review

Immigrants to the United States can take many paths. *Lucky Boy* shares the tale of two families who collide in this novel of adoption, hope, and despair. The author, Shanthi Sekaran, explores illegal immigration and adoption in her first book, *Lucky Boy*. Her writing is beautiful and poetic and made for an easy read.

Soli arrives from Mexico, undocumented and pregnant, having survived a harrowing trip across the border. Finally arriving in Berkeley, she makes contact with a cousin who takes her in and helps her find a job as a nanny to a Berkeley family.

Kavya, whose parents immigrated to the United States from India before she was born, is struggling to get pregnant. She and her husband, Rishi turn to adoption after being unable to conceive. After the birth of her baby, Soli's life is turned upside down when she ends up in a detention center and separated from her son, Ignacio, (Nacho) after a traffic stop. Nacho, now "Iggy" ends up in the home of

Kavya and Rishi for a "temporary" placement which turns to permanent as Soli is unable to defend her parental rights from detention.

While the book certainly is about journeys and strangers, adoption and motherhood, above all it is about ups and downs of luck and the accidents of circumstance. We learn that one traffic stop, one unfortunate encounter with the law and lives can change lives forever.

The book gave us an opportunity to tackle issues of privilege, immigration, family dynamics, adoption and ultimately the fate of Ignacio. Was he "Lucky" to have two women who loved him unconditionally? Sekaran's handling of this situation, though humanistic and ultimately uplifting, does not oversimplify or sugarcoat the wrenching difficulty of such a situation.

The circumstances feel well-researched, but Sekaran never lets that research get in the way of what is, at its core, a gripping story.
