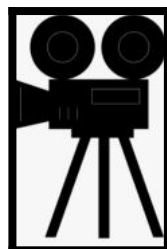

Happy Spring from your Leadership Team

These have been trying times for all of us. Some of us are affected more than others. While we are all stuck here at home, there are many out in public trying to help life keep moving forward. Any day now our local and state governing officials will be announcing the plan for reopening society.

This will not be back to a life-as-we-knew-it for quite a while— if ever. The reopening of our community will be in a three-phase approach. The first will be opening only some of our local businesses while continuing to maintain social distancing. People will be asked to stay six feet from each other and to gather in groups of ten or less. Wearing masks out in public will be encouraged. It is already required in some parts of California. Restaurants will be take-out and, if wishing to serve in their dining area, will need to accommodate the social distancing guidelines. Those individuals who are at high risk of complications or dying from this virus will be asked to continue to shelter at home. Finally, if there is an upswing in cases then the community will be asked to return to sheltering at home.

Karen joined AAUW in 2014 when Carolyn Baker was Membership Chair. The two knew each other from their time working together in Mariposa Schools. Karen became interested in AAUW through the Tech Trek project in which two of her three daughters participated over the years.

Karen received her BA from Wheaton and her Masters' degree in social work from George Williams College. She applied her training as a social worker in schools, and for a time worked in schools in San Mateo County, working with deaf and mentally challenged students. When Karen's daughters were young, she took a 10 year hiatus to be a full-time mom, and then returned to work as a counselor in Mariposa schools.

Professionally, one of the accomplishments of which Karen is most proud is having obtained grants and other community-based funding to establish and sustain the Mental Health Initiative, which focused on prevention of mental health issues by providing services to very young children.

Karen is married to Willy Rust, who recently retired from a 26-year career with the National Parks Department in Yosemite and Falls Church, VA. Together they have been enjoying travel and the outdoors. Presently, Willy is away for an extended family project, and taking care of their daughter, who has contracted



COVID-19. In the meantime, Karen has discovered the joys and feelings of accomplishment with a home improvement project: painting the living room and kitchen! (Watch out, Willy, this can become addictive!)

Karen belongs to the Hiking and the Corks & Forks Wine SIGs. She has sampled a couple of other SIGs, but like many of us, decided that she could only manage two groups

and still keep her life in balance. One of the highlights of her participation in the hiking SIG is a "three-waterfall hike" in Yosemite, with lunch at the top of Nevada Falls, and ending at Glacier Point—where, Karen says, "You have to keep an eye on Naoko!"

During this time of staying sequestered against the pandemic, Karen has discovered a new joy, taking part in a "Kinder Zoom" with granddaughter Lupine (age 5), who lives in Helena Montana. What is a Kinder Zoom? It is an arrangement whereby Karen and a couple of other adult relatives sign up on a regular weekly schedule to provide lessons to Lupine via Zoom. Branches throughout the state had the chance to weigh in as to whether these girls would get to attend camp the summer of 2021. Our Mariposa branch voted to allow these girls to attend at that time. Unfortunately, the majority of the branches voted that these girls would NOT be allowed to attend Tech Trek. We will instead start next year with selecting a new set of 7th graders to attend the summer of

2021. This information saddened us immensely. We so wished these girls would have the opportunity to participate. With that being said, we as a branch want to find a way to make it up to these girls in some way. We have, as a committee and with the Leadership Team, already been throwing out ideas of ways to compensate this year's selected campers. We will be developing a committee to brainstorm ideas, choose the best idea, and then carry out our choice. This will be an excellent way for members to get involved in many different ways—both big and small. If you have ideas, please watch for announcements asking for volunteers. We are looking at doing this for the girls during the summer of 2021 so that we do not have to worry about any limitations from the virus.

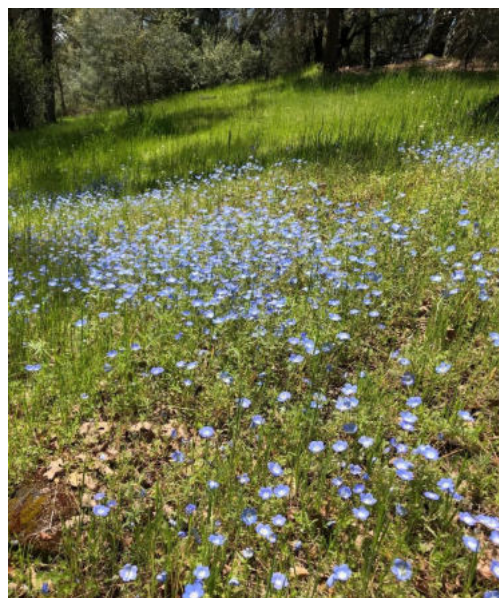
Foreign Policy Association

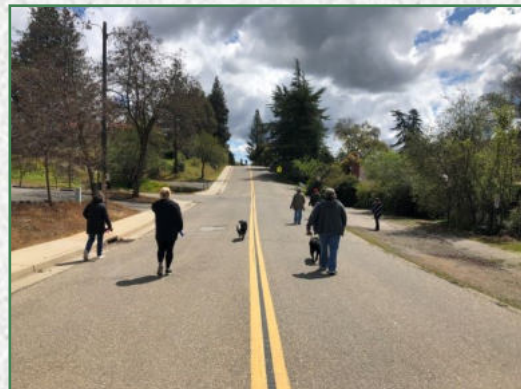
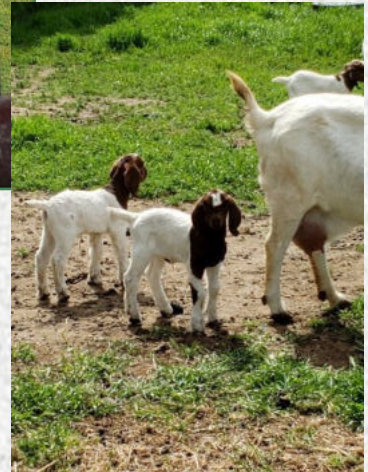
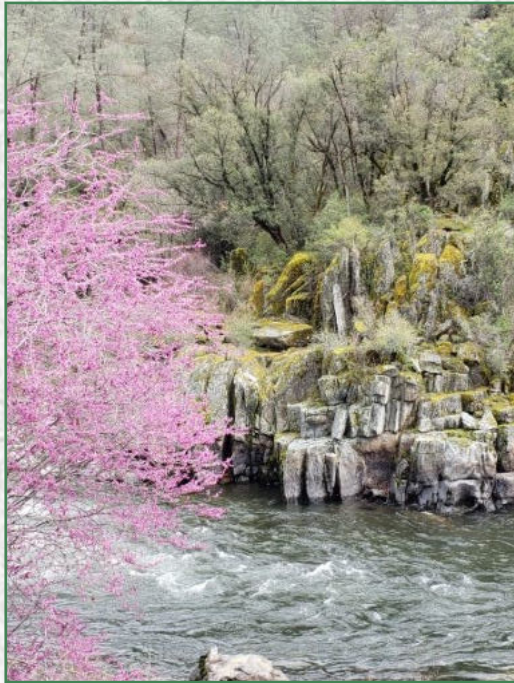

How to walk 4000 miles without moving

The play Reading Group demonstrated COVID creativity and experimented with a way to “read” this month’s play “4000 Miles.” We watched a YouTube video of its production by a regional theater group and then Zoomed into an online discussion. This was a fairly contemporary play for us (written after the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic!) It concerned a young man who bicycled across the country to “find himself”

and wound up on the doorstep of his feisty, but lonely, 91-year-old grandmother. It’s a play about finding connections in unlikely places. The group found it distracting to watch the poorly filmed stage production (think of people crossing in front of the camera) instead of reading aloud. But we found it interesting to talk about how different the characters’ appearance and delivery were compared to

our mind’s eye when we read the play on our own. We even took an online trivia quiz about the play, which added some delight until we saw that we only got a B+.

The Play Reading Group agreed to shelter the rest of our plays back in their home at the Southern California branch for the rest of the year. But we plan a Broadway revival next fall.

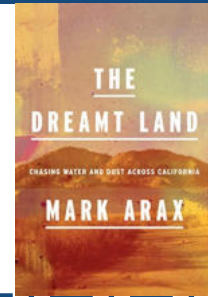

***Next Year in Havana***

For our April book discussion, we read ***Next Year in Havana***, by Chanel Cleeton. This was our first meeting after the shelter-in-place conditions, so we utilized Zoom for our discussion. I would say it went well, though I think we all prefer the face-to-face discussions. We are, however, thankful that technology allows us to carry on in some manner. The novel was about two women: Marisol, an American-born Cuban descendent and her grandmother, Elisa, who was born in Cuba and fled to the US with her family after Castro took over. Elisa had passed away and had asked that her favorite granddaughter, Marisol, take her ashes back to Cuba to spread them. Both of these women were members of privileged families. However, the privileged life they both shared made it difficult for most of us to relate to either one of them. Many of us

in our group had always thought of Cuban refugees as being less wealthy, so there were many aspects of the story that were surprising. The novel switched back and forth between Marisol's present-day Cuba visit and the pre-Castro Cuba in the

late 1950's when Elisa was only 19. Marisol was able to discover many of her grandmother's secrets including finding out that her biological grandfather was not the grandfather she knew in the US, but was actually a Cuban freedom fighter in the revolution.

The group found the novel interesting and easy to read while highlighting some of the history of the Cuban revolution that we may not have understood before. Our next Book SIG meeting is Tuesday, May 13 at 4:30 pm, and our book for discussion in [The Dreamt Land](#) by Mark Arax.
