AAUW CALIFORNIA PUBLIC POLICY TEAM READY FOR A NEW YEAR!

The twelve members of the AAUW California Public Policy Committee are excited to get started on our goals for the upcoming year. We are focusing on helping branches find innovative ways to increase their public policy mission-based programs in this time of COVID, and are preparing five virtual workshops on Our Role in Ending Racial Injustice; GOTV (Get Out The Vote); Why Public Policy Matters; Title IX; and How to Talk to Legislators. Dates and times can be found on the [website](#).

We are also planning a Lobby Day for next April, and are urging all branches to include funding in their budgets to send at least one member to this important event. We will have more details later but wanted to give you an early “heads up.”

In solidarity with the Black Lives Matter movement, the Public Policy team has committed to becoming an ally for Black women, and we will be producing monthly articles for your branch newsletters on how different public policy issues affect this population. We hope all branches will publish them and join us in this critical work.

On another note, we are thrilled to pronounce victory and final closure on the Aileen Rizo case! A brief refresher: Rizo was

paid less than her male counterparts based on her past salary history. She sued and eventually got a ruling from the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals that held that using prior salary alone cannot justify a wage differential between employees. Her employer appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court and on July 2nd they voted to let the 9th Circuit opinion stand.

And finally, a fun way to honor the 100th Anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment: The Women’s Suffrage Centennial Commission waged a “Forward Into Light” campaign. They asked everyone to contact their local officials to urge them to shine purple and gold spotlights on their city and county buildings on August 26th, the day the Amendment was certified. I wrote a letter urging the Governor to light up the state capitol.


Covid Corner

Friends and neighbors, there is little news to report on the COVID front. Although we are doing well in our little county of Mariposa, it is wise to keep in mind that there are many around us who choose not to take the pandemic as seriously as we do.

Some of the larger counties that had been on the watch lists are being taken off. Fresno, as of the 27th of August (per our public health department), is finally seeing signs of improvement in their numbers.

Yet, there are others that are still seeing surges in numbers. Merced sits at our doorsteps. As of the date of this writing, it



had a case rate of 950 cases per 100,000 population over a two-week reporting period. So much more than ours! In fact, it was the highest in the state! For us, that

simply accentuates our need to continue to follow safety measures:

- limit travel only to what is necessary
- wear masks
- wash hands
- monitor your health
- be patient

August 3, 2020, 5:30 p.m.
Virtual Meeting via Zoom

Meeting Called to Order at 5:34 p.m. by Cindy Harp.

Minutes (*Rebecca Swisher*)

- Rebecca Swisher reported that the July 2020 meeting minutes were approved electronically and submitted to Jill for inclusion in July/August newsletter. She noted that although the June 2020 meeting minutes were also submitted for inclusion, per past precedent, only the most recent minutes (i.e., July 2020) were included in the combined months' newsletter.

Membership Update (*Dina Lambert, Bonnie Little*)

- Bonnie Little provided a report on current membership totals. She stated that 66 members have renewed for the 2020-2021 year, and seven did not renew. Of the latter tally, five individuals moved, and two did not provide a reason for not continuing membership. This has left nine outstanding members, five of whom verbalized intent to renew. One member has reinstated after taking a year hiatus.
- Dina Lambert reported that she and Bonnie are going to get together to work on the directory and that she will be handing off management of the membership list.
- Dina Lambert stated that Sandi Gabe will send out the Survey Monkey for individuals to join this year's SIGs.

Finance Report (*Dina Lambert*)

- July 2020 Finance Report: Dina Lambert presented the July 2020 financial report and noted that the proposed budget needs to be presented to membership for a vote.
 - Total income: \$1,026.00

Income: \$823 in dues (\$413 will be sent to national, \$140 will be sent to state, and \$270 will stay with Mariposa AAUW), \$203 returned from deposit of tables and chairs for the rescheduled Mad Hatter event

- Total expenses: \$744.55
Expenses: \$6 for website hosting, \$185.55 to reimburse Cathy Owens for backpack project expenses
- Balance: \$19,208.21
- Rebecca Swisher moved to accept the July 2020 report as presented. Cindy Harp seconded. All in favor with no nays or abstentions.
- See “New Business” on page 14 for additional discussion of budget regarding Chamber of Commerce dues increase.
- Funds Assessment
Dina Lambert reported that she intends to pay this bill in September.
- Business Card in the Newsletter
Trish Darcy will send out an e-mail to members reminding them of the opportunity to advertise in the newsletter.

Standing Projects:

- Dinner with a Scientist (*Marilyn Saunders*)
On hold.
- Backpack (*Cathy Owens, Kim Monson & Rebecca Swisher*)
Kim Monson and Rebecca Swisher provided an update on this event over the past two Saturdays. Kim stated that she had given out the allotted 40 backpacks at the Mariposa event by 11:30 a.m., and then she gave out ones that had been donated by other groups to help. She stated that she could have probably distributed an additional 12 backpacks. Rebecca noted that the Coulterville event was much slower until the woman who owned the candy store put out a message on Facebook. She also stated that she has been contacted by Mariposa Safe Families with a request for the last five middle school backpacks, and she is waiting for the person to send her the names, grades, and schools before she delivers them.
- Tech Trek (*Trish Darcy*)
 - ◇ Event for the 2020 Tech Trek Girls -On hold.
 - ◇ Trish Darcy reported that she plans to regroup in a few weeks to ensure everyone who wants to participate has the opportunity. They will meet via Zoom. She is excited about the ideas that have already been presented.
 - ◇ 2021 Tech Trek- On hold.
- Tech Connect: Multimedia Messages (*Rebecca Swisher and Kim Monson*)
 - ◇ Kim Monson reported that students will be doing distance learning. She will get in touch with Celeste Azevedo, high school principal, to get permission to connect with students. Rebecca Swisher stated that once this permission is received, the plan is to request for member volunteers to meet to discuss what translates from Speech

Trek to the new program.

Fundraisers:

- “Mad Hatter’s Party” (*Sandi Gabe*)
Cindy Harp reported that we will await a tentative date from Sandi Gabe.
- Flea Market (*Jody Sergienko*)
Jody Sergienko suggested a Flea Market event and asked if folks would be interested. Rebecca Swisher recommended that we monitor the COVID-19 situation and consider this approach if things remain the same. Dina Lambert stated that at this time additional funds are not needed to support the current projects and programs. Those present concurred with the “wait and see” approach.

Programs:

- College Partnership with Reedley College in Oakhurst (*Cindy Harp*)
On hold.
- Support for Local College Students (*Jody Sergienko*)
 - ◇ Jody Sergienko reported that she has been having conversations with college students who have been relegated to on-line learning. Dina Lambert supported looking further into this challenge.
 - ◇ Jody Sergienko suggested that we look further into supporting women to match with vocational education/apprenticeships. Rebecca Swisher recommended support for this
- Hospital Bond Forum via Zoom (*Trish Darcy*)
Trish Darcy reported that Therese Williams, John C. Fremont Healthcare District Public Relations and Community Outreach Director, requested that AAUW host a forum for Matthew Matthiessen to discuss the hospital bond in October. Group discussion was held and it was determined to hold the forum on 10/08/2020 at 6:00 p.m. (**NOTE: Date was subsequently changed to Wednesday, 09/23/2020.**) Trish will put on the AAUW calendar. Jody Sergienko will look into the tech required for doing this via Zoom and Facebook at the same time. Regardless, the plan is to record the presentation and post it to the AAUW Mariposa website and Facebook page. Trish will message Therese to find out what format they intend to use (presentation vs. Q&A, etc.).

Old Business:

- Purchase of New PA System and A/V Equipment
Jody Sergienko will follow up with local venues to see what equipment they use to get feedback. She recommended that, if possible, to consider a local source for purchase of the equipment.

New Business:

- Chamber of Commerce Membership:
 - * Jody Sergienko followed up with the Chamber today. She found out that the Chamber's finance person stopped invoicing to clean up their documentation and that the Chamber calendar is not being updated at this time. However, social media, marketing, and advertising are being done. Jody picked up the member application paperwork and communication form. She reported that \$120 will give AAUW Mariposa executive-level membership. Discussion occurred regarding completion of the application. It was determined that Jody will provide the paperwork to Dina Lambert who will fill out the application and submit it along with the fee.
 - * Dina Lambert moved that we increased the budget for "Chamber Dues" to \$120 and to pay these annual dues. Kim Monson seconded. All in favor with no nays or abstentions.

New Ideas for 2020-2021:

- Program Ideas (*Jody Sergienko*)

Jody Sergienko discussed the current social awareness issues being brought out in our country. She would like to focus on the unwritten history of women who built the country, and Mariposa specifically. Those present concurred that this is a timely topic. Jody will do some research and see if there are folks who could be speakers.
- Scholarship Program (*Trish Darcy*)

Trish Darcy presented the idea for AAUW Mariposa to provide a scholarship to junior and senior women in college. Other groups have similar programs, which work well. She sent out example documents to the Leadership Team members. Those present approved of this idea and determined to move forward with gathering information.
- 100th Anniversary of Women's Right to Vote Article (*Kim Monson*)

Kim Monson stated that she is writing an article for the Mariposa Gazette on the 100th anniversary of women's right to vote and requested assistance in editing it for length. Jody Sergienko and Cindy Harp volunteered to assist with this.
- Presentation of Women in History on AAUW's Social Media (*Rebecca Swisher*)

Rebecca Swisher stated that she would like to see AAUW Mariposa post information about women's history and women's suffrage. She will locate social media notices and send them to Trish Darcy to post on Facebook. Trish will forward the information to Dina Lambert to post on the AAUW Mariposa website.
