

Don and I visited southeast Asia in

December 2018. On that trip, we met Ruth Rathblott, who was born with a limb difference; one arm was shorter than the other and the hand on that arm was very tiny and functionless.

Over the course of our journey, we became friends with Ruth. This year, Ruth wrote a book about being different. This wasn't a book about dealing with a disability; it was a book for all of us who have been hiding our differences and a book about expanding the diversity conversation to include everyone. As some of you may know, my husband

Don fell and broke his ankle on that trip and Ruth became my emotional support.

Our book group conversation was candid and moved in a direction that I didn't expect. Don't we all, in some respects feel we are different in ways that may not be seen as acceptable? I remember my

adolescence with frizzy hair, braces, and an angry complexion; this difference, with maturity, dissipated (though my hair is still frizzy). Ruth's difference is with her for a lifetime. Many in our group were former schoolteachers who had worked with children with differences much more profound than Ruth's.

Our conversation was eye-opening and allowed us to share personal experiences. One of Ruth's messages is to own your difference; it may be your greatest gift.

reading of a famous modern artist's will, secrets were revealed by a host of characters including a Russian princess and a former show girl. There were 14 in all and



other red wines. It is a bit more robust than the pinot noir, but lighter than a zinfandel or cabernet sauvignon.

After a delightful repast of light savory dishes, we gathered as a single group and discussed each winery's offering, noting the subtle differences. It was especially enjoyable to share and hear everyone's different observations. The most notable differences were that of age and cost. Those that were only 2 years old could definitely have used a few more years to age and develop their flavors.

Each bottle was clearly labeled



with the name and location of the winery, the vintage year, where it was purchased, and how much it cost. There appeared to be a direct correlation between how much the bottle cost and how complex the flavors were. The more spent on it, the more we enjoyed it. Go figure!
