





The International Study group met at the home of Nancy and Peter Sproul in April. Atop Mt. Bullion we were treated with magnificent views and amazing food as well as a comprehensive look (and listen) to traditional music of the Vietnamese culture. As with so many cultural folk traditions, the instruments serve an important role in ritual ceremonies and

story telling. The stringed instruments resemble those of others around the globe, from the single stringed "Danbau" to the many stringed "Dan tranh" zither. Some are plucked, some strummed, some played with a bow. Similarly, the drums, percussive wood, gongs, double reeds, and flutes, as seen throughout the world, have a unique look and sound in the



Vietnamese tradition. Peter shared his extensive research and the instrument models he and Nancy have collected.

A small but loquacious group gathered to read the drama, *Marjorie Prime*. It was a nice departure to read something that was written about "modern" times and not the era before indoor plumbing.

Written in 2016, the play ironically predicted the coming age of artificial intelligence, which was encapsulated in a humanoid "robot" that served as a youthful, handsome companion to an elderly woman experiencing dementia. Her endearing and patient "Prime" was programmed to collect only the memories she chose to share and fed them back to her endlessly in a self-curated story of her life.

As the play moved along, we met three members of the woman's family who tried to share different, possibly more authentic memories. But, in a delightful twist at the end, we learned that two of them were, in fact, "Primes" too.

The author's question was: What would we remember, and what would we forget, if given the chance? But the real question was: how far will technology go in mimicking the human mind? This play probably felt science fiction-y in 2016. Not so today. Order your Prime now.
