Jill Harry recommends a series on Showtime/ Paramount Plus, titled *The Agency*. It stars




Michael Fassbender,



The Personal Librarian

Seldom do you see a book written in the first person. In addition, this book was written by two acclaimed authors. This work of historical fiction follows the path of Belle Marion Greener (aka Belle da Costa Greene) who, as a very young

librarian at Princeton, finds herself hired as the personal librarian of J.P. Morgan, one of the wealthiest people in the world. It is her job to organize his world-renowned library collection and assist in the acquisition of new art and literature. But there is a caution: she is a light-skinned woman of African American descent

who is "passing" as white. Set at the beginning of the early 1900s, she tiptoes through high society, rubbing elbows with the wealthy and top dealers in art and print. The book touches on racism and the challenges a person of color faced daily during those

tumultuous times.

The book, being historical fiction, prompted a lively discussion of the characters, how they were portrayed, and how we might relate to them. We also questioned the alignment of the narration with two separate authors and their different writing styles.

Four readers gathered to read six characters' parts in the dramatic play *Time of My Life* by British author Alan Ayckbourn. It was challenging, but nothing is too hard for AAUW women fueled by coffee and chocolate biscotti.

All the scenes were set in the same Italian restaurant, but with a revolving set of characters composed of the parents, an older son and his wife, and the younger son and his new girlfriend. To complicate things, the play had a challenging timeline, with scenes jumping from the present to the future, back to the past, then to the future, then to the present and so on until we were not at all

sure what century we are currently living in. As we got more comfortable with the format, we began to appreciate it as a metaphor for how complicated family relationships are with their skeletons from the past and their portents for the future. Luckily, we didn't have to think too much about those deeper meanings because the dialogue was frequently punctuated by silly comments from the waiters, who spoke some kind of Pidgin Italian that was hard---but laughable—to read aloud.

All in all, it was a satisfying read, although we were all left with a strange craving for meatballs.
