

From 1858 until 1947, England ruled over India under the name of the Raj. The Henna Artist takes place shortly after this in the early 1950s. Vestiges of the former regime still linger. Escaping from an abusive marriage, seventeen-year-old Lakshmi Shastri makes her way alone from her rural

village to the pink city of Jaipur. There she becomes the henna artist and confidante most in demand to women of the upper class. With her career well underway, she is



surprised by a visit from her thirteenyear-old sister, Radha, whom Lakshmi didn't know even existed. Add to that her colorful helper, streetwise Malik, who says he is nine, but we never know. The book was engaging not only for the discussion of henna art, but also the herbal remedies that Lakshmi becomes known for. We all
