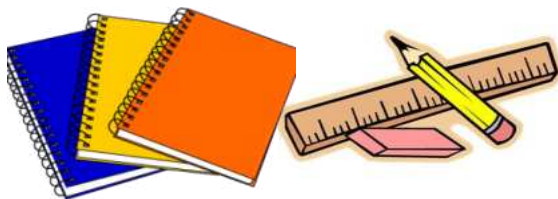
Project: Backpack

This year we were once again very successful. Members joined together to stuff supplies into 72 backpacks. We then sent 20 packs to Coulterville for the north county event in Coulterville. When only 14 were claimed there, the remaining 6 were added to the 50 to distribute at the back-to-school event in Mariposa at Mariposa Safe Families. Surprisingly, we still had three left unclaimed. We took those to the middle school counselor at Woodland Elementary. Why Woodland you might ask? 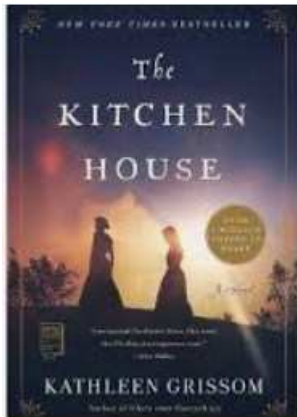


Member Corner: Idea exchange

We have two very interesting recommendations from Trish Darcy this month.



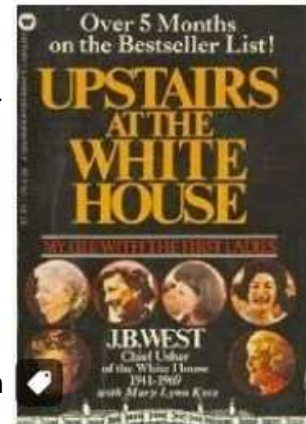

kitchen house by the master's illegitimate daughter, Belle, the novel explores themes of family, race, class, and survival, as well as resilience and connection.

The second is a memoir titled **Upstairs at the White** House written by J B West, along with

Mary Lynn Kotz. JB West was Chief usher at the White House for nearly three decades. Published in 1973, the book offers a unique account of life in the presidential residence. His tenure started with Eleanor Roosevelt and ended with Pat Nixon. It must have been fascinating as well as challenging to work with these different personalities, dealing with the political and social ramifications of the times, as well as choices of décor, state dinners, and other important events.

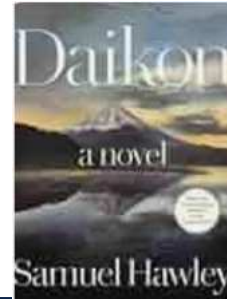

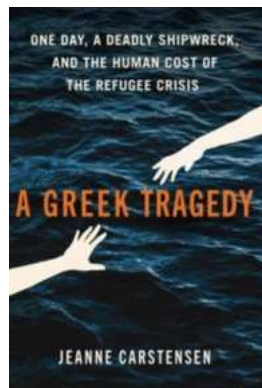

A Greek Tragedy by Jeanne Carstensen

What would it take for you to leave your homeland with nothing but the shirt on your back? Thousands of refugees from Syria, Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Iran have made the sometimes-fatal choice to flee to Turkey and, using often their last funds, pay a smuggler to ferry them from Turkey to the Greek island of Lesbos, where they can seek asylum from a European Union member country.

Author [Jeanne Carstensen](#) has chosen one fateful day, October 28, 2015, to chronicle the voyage made by hundreds on a dilapidated ferry that should never have sailed.



The short, 30-minute trip should have been quick and easy. But the treacherous waters and poor condition of the ship led to a catastrophic sinking.

Researching with the eye of meticulous news reporter, Carstensen leads us from the beginning of the trip to the heroic life-saving efforts of hundreds of Greek residents on the tiny island of Lesbos.

Subtitled One Day, a Deadly Shipwreck, and the Human Cost of the Refugee Crisis, the book is a quick, but somber read. Nevertheless, our group felt it was time well spent.
